

SUPPLY LIST FOR: "PAINTING LANDSCAPE FABRICS" (two-day class)
Instructor: Mickey Lawler

Note: The most successful painting classes occur when students can work in a large, well-lighted room with direct access to an outdoor area for sunprinting and drying fabric in good weather.

Each student must bring:

- **Brushes and sponges:**
 - a couple kitchen sponges plus 2 natural sponges about the size of your hand
 - 8 (total) cheap 1"- 4" natural bristle brushes and 2 – 4 sponge brushes. You will find both styles of brushes at Dollar stores, Home Depot, etc. The natural bristle brushes have the word “bristle” on the wooden handles. These should not cost more than \$.59 - \$1.50 apiece.
- apron (or wear old clothes)
- plastic bags for the possibility of having to take home some damp fabric
- several rubber gloves (disposable doctor-type from pharmacy work best)
- small box of coarse kosher salt or COARSE sea salt. Gourmet/ health food shops carry this. (A limited supply will be available for class use.)
- Two - three 20" X 30" pieces of 1/4" – 1/2" thick Foamcore (art supply store or Staples)
- 4 to 5 yards of white 100% cotton fabric cut or torn into approximate (no larger than 22" X 16") fat quarters. It's not necessary to prewash fabric if drops of water sink immediately into the fabric. However, if drops of water sit on the surface, pre-wash fabric with detergent or choose a different fabric. No need to iron.
- A small amount of silk (any kind) and some "white-on-white" cotton might be fun also.
- A package of spring-type clothes pins (12 pins are sufficient.)
- Permanent marking pen, scissors, paper towels, a few straight pins
- 10-15 half pint cottage cheese-style containers or 12 snack-size “Gladware”-style containers
- Light-weight plastic drop cloth, cut into 16 -20 pieces, approx. 2ft. X 1.5 ft. (Clear or white plastic only, please)
- Plastic plant mister or spray bottle (Make sure it “mists.”)

\$25 materials fee per student for paints, materials for sunprinting, etc.
